The Office of Research and Postgraduate Studies, Solomon Islands National University (SINU) recently held a mini seminar to support academic staff from the Faculty of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (FAFF), and Faculty of Education and Humanities (FEH), who are aspiring to advance their studies as of next year.

This event was marked by a strong spirit of academic dedication and collaboration, provided staff a platform to present their research interests and PhD proposals to an esteemed panel and their peers.

The Director of Research and Postgraduate Studies, Associate Professor Dr. Hugo Bugoro, applauded the presenters for their commitment and enthusiasm, given the short notice to prepare for the event.




