Campaign Period: 2nd March 2025 – 14th March 2025

Election Day: 17th March 2025

Students cast their votes to elect the new SINUSA Executive and Faculty Representatives.

Counting and Results Declaration: 18th March 2025

The votes will be counted, and results will be officially announced.
